- Maintain accurate assessment records and contribute to moderation processes as required.
- Support the development of culturally safe and empowering learning environments.
- Actively engage in Assessor Forums and continual personal development.

- *Assessment Practice Certification:* Holding Unit Standard 30421 or 4098 (or equivalent).
- Proven experience in assessing adult ākonga in work-based or community settings.
- Deep knowledge and lived experience of Tikanga Māori, with the ability to apply and

explain concepts in diverse learning contexts.

- Relevant tertiary qualification(s) in Māori Studies, Education, or a related field (preferred).
